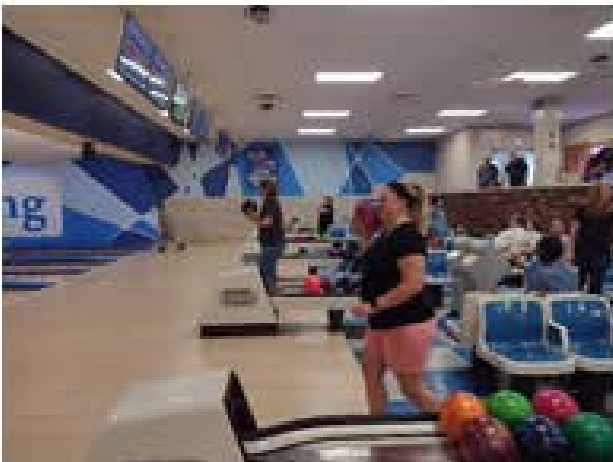

Technical Writing

This instruction manual was created to help constituents navigate the brand new Water Rat Calculator tool the County created. The rates increased by double digits and would affect all customers, including some private businesses which were the largest customers. The calculator tool was designed to help customers understand how much they would be paying under the new rates.

This instruction sheet was posted on the website and shared at public meetings by the County Administrator (the County's CEO).

It received positive feedback from County staff and constituents.



How to Use the Online Rate Calculator

Things You Will Need

1. Copy of your water/sewer bill.
2. Internet Connection

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. Open your web browser (e.g., Internet Explorer, Chrome, Firefox).
2. Type in this web address: www.mcoho.org/water_services/rate_calculator.cfm.
3. The Rate Calculator will look like this:

Source water protection programs include land use control zoning, chemical inventory restrictions, business and industrial inspections, as well as education and outreach.
8. The **Daily Capital Charge** is an investment in the maintenance and improvement of our water and sewer system through infrastructure repairs, replacement, and rehabilitation. Investing in infrastructure helps to ensure that our water and sewer services remain safe, reliable and secure now and for future generations.
9. **All consumption (Sewer)** is the volume-based charge for sewer usage at your home or business, which is based on your water consumption/usage. Your sewer usage may be different from your water usage if you have a deduct and/or irrigation-type meter at your home or business.

Applications Now Available for Ohio EMA Tornado Safe Room Rebates

Deadline to apply is Mar. 5 at 5 p.m.

Dayton, Ohio (Jan. 14, 2021) – The Ohio Emergency Management Agency (EMA) is again offering the Ohio Safe Room Rebate Program to help Montgomery County homeowners build tornado safe rooms on their properties.

The Ohio Safe Room Rebate Program provides homeowners randomly selected for a rebate, with up to \$4,875 toward the construction/installation of the safe room. It must meet Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requirements found in FEMA publications 320 and 361 and cannot be constructed or installed without first receiving the notification to proceed from Ohio EMA once.

In 2019, 21 tornadoes struck Ohio during Memorial Day weekend. The tornadoes killed two people and caused an estimated \$1 billion in damages, proving to be the most destructive natural disaster in Ohio history.

“Our community has been through a lot over the past two years and we understand just how real the damage from natural disasters can be,” said Montgomery County Commission President Judy Dodge. “The safety of citizens is our top priority, which is why we are pleased this program is once again available.”

The rebate program is funded by a partnership between the Ohio EMA and FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant programs.

Applicants are selected using a computerized random selection process. Montgomery County homeowners have until 5 p.m. on March 5, 2021 to apply. Selected homeowners will be notified by e-mail of their position on the priority list on or after March 12.



Montgomery County wants to ensure that everyone who signed up for emergency alerts through www.mcoho.org/alerts is still able to receive them after 3G operations are phased out.

The exact timing of the phase out will vary by company and may change. Consult your mobile provider's website for the most up-to-date information.

This change affects not only phones, but any device relying on cellular connectivity such as certain medical devices, tablets, smart watches and more.

It is important to plan now so that you don't lose connectivity, including the ability to call 911.

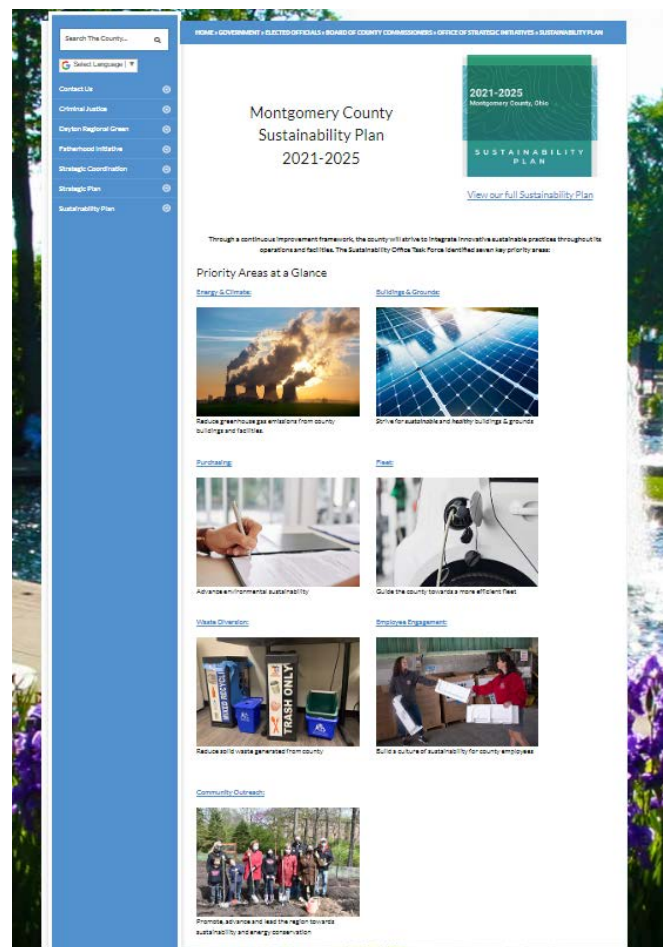
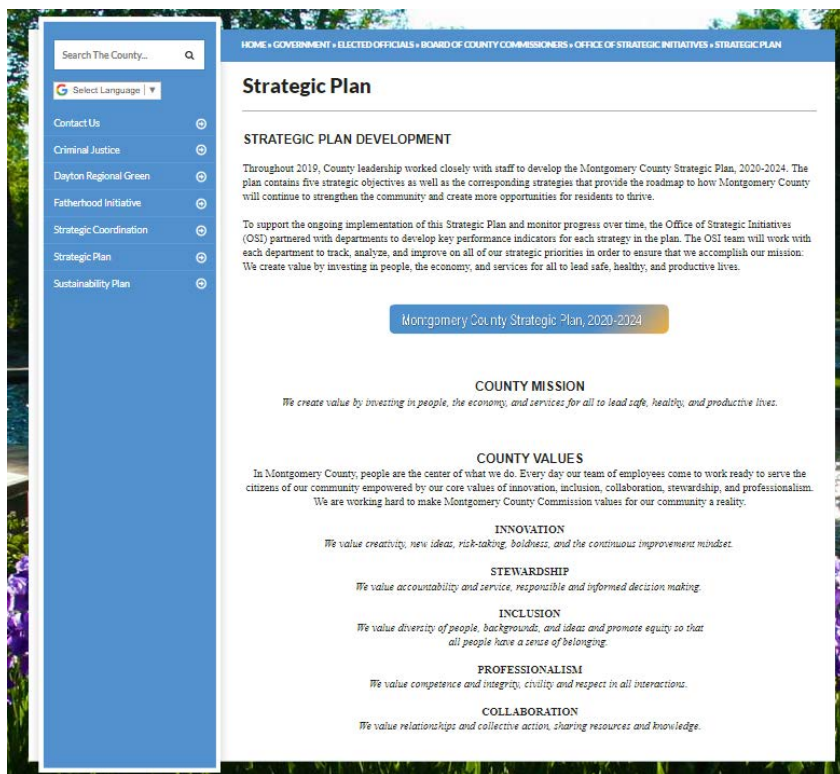


Screenshots of the Office of Strategic Initiatives' website when it was first constructed.

The RCAA provides participants with case management services and offers the opportunity to connect with local community resources, service providers, and employers.



The 4-week program consists of 29 workshops, Tuesday through Thursday, from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., concluding with a focus group and graduation ceremony. These holistic workshops are coordinated and facilitated by the Montgomery County Office of Reentry staff and consultants, in partnership with community partners to address the needs of individuals with criminal history barriers and life challenges.

Workshop topics include: Reentry Planning, Offender Workforce Development & Retention, Personal/Family & Social Responsibility, Behavioral Health, Housing, Healthcare, Behavioral Management, Financial Literacy, Networking, Legal Issues, Education, and other supportive services.

Orientation and workshops are held at the Reentry Training Center located in the Job Center, 1111 S. Edwin C. Moses Blvd, Suite 1175 Dayton, Ohio 45417.

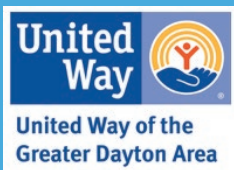

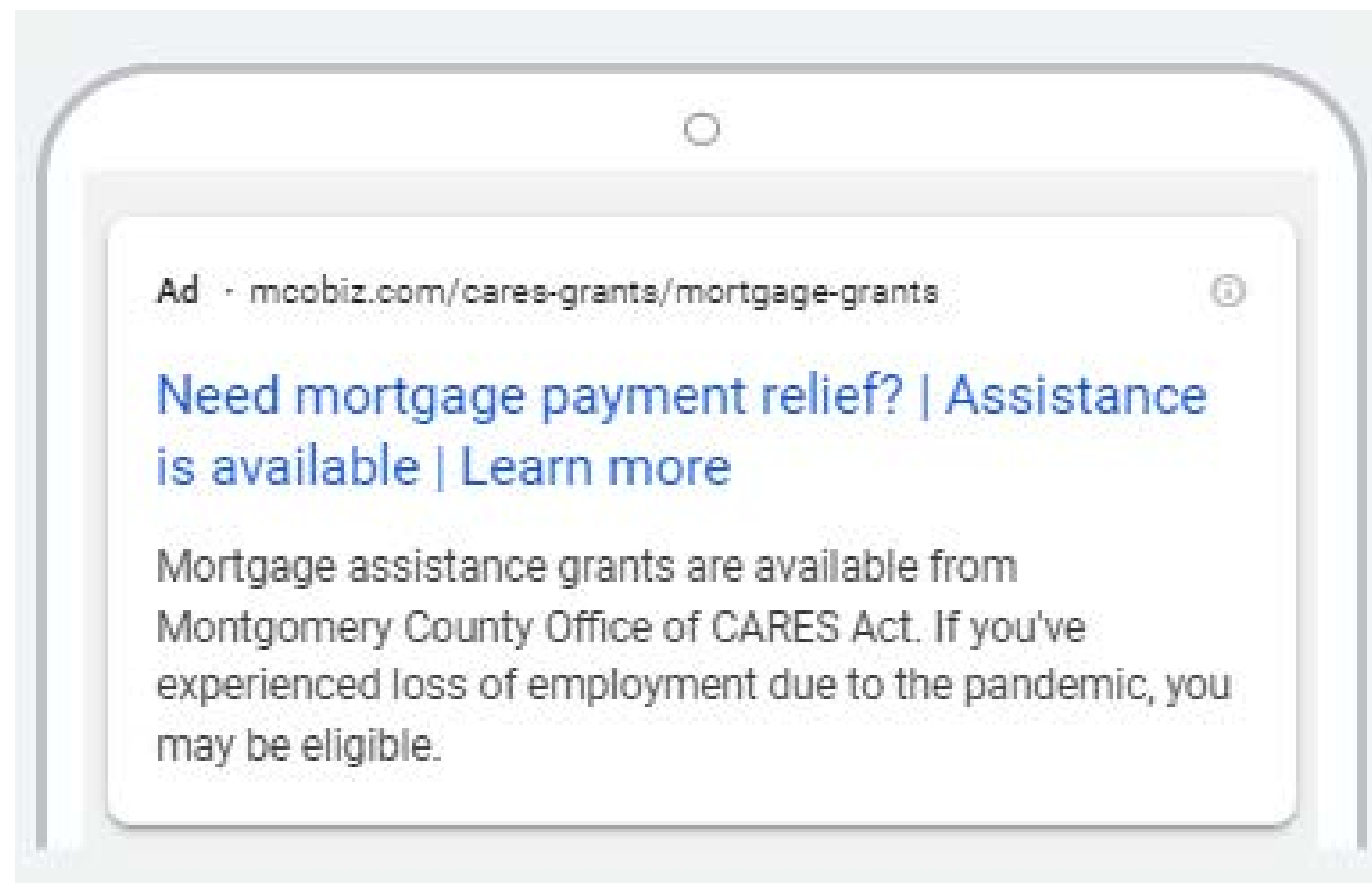

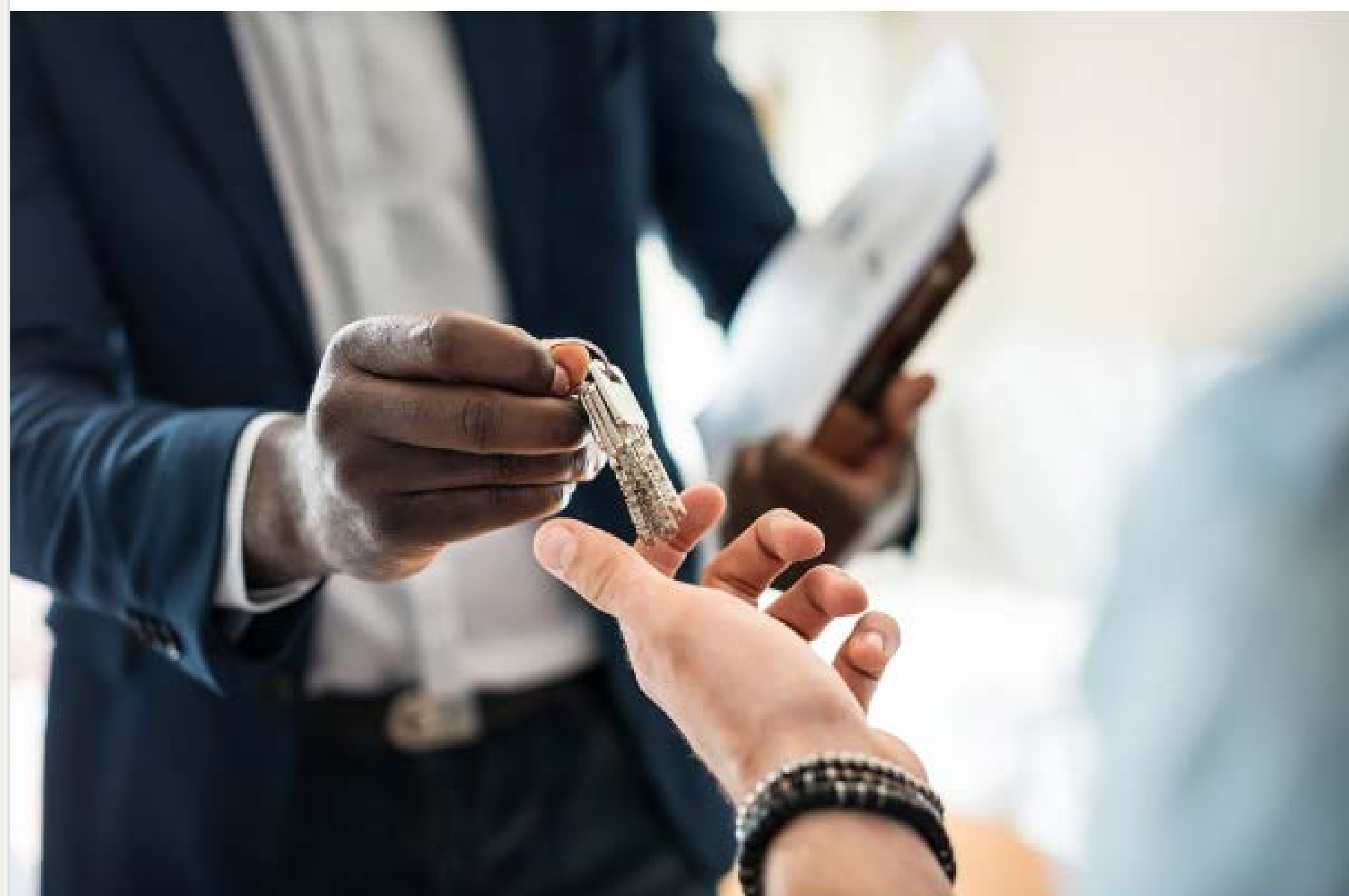
